Course Description:

This course provides an introduction to the fundamental concepts of storytelling and fictional writing, including characterization, world-building, dialogue, conflict, plot, and incorporating socio-cultural themes, as well as provides opportunities for students to practice and build their writing skills through writing prompts.

Course Organization: The course is divided into six units.

Materials Required:

Computer or tablet with Internet access

Academic Dishonesty: With most correspondence courses as well as AKGrad & YKSD, honesty of parents and students is essential. Grading: In this course you will be graded on free-writes, assignments, and projects.

- **Free-Writes:** There are 46 free-writes. These prompts are designed to be vague. Let your imagination run with them. Think outside the box and whatever comes to mind when you read the prompt go for it. Typically these should be about half a page.
- Assignments: There are 18 assignments. These are designed to help build up your final papers. Assignments include short written assignments, surveys, outlines, illustrations, and collages.
- **Final Projects:** There are 5 projects. These are more extensive and formal writing projects. Final projects vary in length with the longest being at least six pages, double spaced.
