## LANGUAGE ARTS 10

### COURSE DESCRIPTION

The tenth-grade language arts course connects reading instruction with writing for multiple purposes. The course continues intensive practice and study of informational and literary reading and writing. Students read extensively from a variety of sources, and draft, revise, and edit their own writing.

This is the first semester of a 2-semester (full-year) course.

### COMPETENCY EXAMS AND PRE-ASSESSMENTS

A competency exam, also known as a competency-based assessment, is usually a form of measurement created by instructors that follows the learning outcomes and objectives of the prospective course. The competency exam can be in the form of a standard test that includes multiple-choice questions, true-false, and short-answer.

Competency exams are OPTIONAL. Students who may not feel comfortable taking the competency exam can skip it. Competency exams do not go against a student's grade and will not hurt a student's grade, regardless of what score they receive.

In order for students to demonstrate competency in a competency exam, they must receive at least 70% or higher on the assessments. If students receive less than 70%, they will be asked to go through the course normally. If students receive 70% or higher, they will be potentially exempted from certain learning outcomes, assignments, and modules in the course.

  - You will have one attempt for each post-assessment.

## INSTRUCTOR EXPECTATIONS AND PACING

A typical semester course at a traditional high school requires 80 hours in total, which is 40 hours per term. Since this is a self-paced course, completing it may take you longer or shorter. You are expected to spend 3-5 hours each week and submit at least one unit each.

Students will be allowed to complete the course at a pace that best suits them. The students will be responsible for completing and turning in all assignments according to their individual needs.

Parents/Guardians will be able to observe and view their student's progress through OnFire.
