

LANGUAGE ARTS 12

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Language Arts 12 is the capstone of high school English studies, preparing students for post-secondary education and the workplace. Students will engage with classic and contemporary literature, develop advanced writing and research skills, analyze a range of texts, and present their ideas effectively in both spoken and written forms.

This is the second semester of a 2-semester (full-year) course.

COMPETENCY EXAMS AND PRE-ASSESSMENTS

A competency exam, also known as a competency-based assessment, is a type of measurement created by instructors that aligns with the learning outcomes and objectives of the course you're about to take. This exam may include multiple-choice questions, true/false questions, and short-answer responses.

Taking the competency exam is completely optional. If you're not comfortable taking it, you can choose to skip it. Your grade will not be affected by whether or not you take the exam, and your score, no matter what it is, will not negatively impact your grade.

To demonstrate competency, you'll need to score at least 70% or higher on the exam. If your score is below 70%, you'll be asked to complete the course as usual. If you score 70% or higher, you may be exempt from certain learning outcomes, assignments, or modules within the course.

INSTRUCTOR EXPECTATIONS AND PACING
