# Launch American Literature

### Course Information:

## **Description:**

This course is designed for students at a lower reading level or students who are At-Risk, or in danger of not graduating high school. Launch American Literature is designed to meet the needs of online students who have had difficulties with traditional classroom or other correspondence classes that do not meet a student's needs and need to earn an English credit.

American Literature is a comprehensive course that covers genres and writing styles through writings about: Forging America's Literary Tradition: 1620-1849; The Inspiration of New England: 1837-1860; Local Color in America: 1849-1889; the Harvest of Realism and Naturalism: 1890-1908; American Literature Comes of Age: 1905-1940; Moving Into Modern Times: 1940-1970; and Contemporary American Literature: 1971-present.

**Course Organization:** The course is divided into seven chapters. Each chapter is broken down into lessons based on learning outcomes. For each lesson, you are required to read a section of the textbook, complete practice problems from the textbook, and then take an online quiz.

#### **Materials Required:**

- Computer or tablet with Internet access
- AGS American Literature Book

**Academic Dishonesty:** With most correspondence courses as well as AKGrad & YKSD, honesty of parents and students is essential. **Grading:** Activities and quizzes are designed to be completed as many times as necessary to earn the grade that you would like to earn. If you are struggling on activities or quizzes, you should contact your online teacher for additional support.

• Assignment Quizzes: Quizzes are computer scored and you can see your incorrect answers immediately so you can retake if necessary. It is also permissible to use notes, study materials, and books on the quizzes.

• **Tests**: You are <u>not allowed</u> to use notes, study materials, and books on the tests. The tests are meant to reflect how much you have learned while completing the lessons.
