Description:

This course is designed for students at a lower reading level or students who are At-Risk, or in danger of not graduating high school. Launch Economics is designed to meet the needs of online students who have had difficulties with traditional classroom or other correspondence classes that do not meet a student's needs and need to earn an Economics credit.

Economics lays the foundation for economic thinking and the ability to make informed choices in the national and international marketplace. This course explores key elements of the free enterprise system: supply, demand, price, competition, business, labor, money and banking, government, and the global economy.

Course Organization: The course is divided into 20 chapters. Each chapter is broken down into lessons based on learning outcomes. For each lesson, you are required to read a section of the textbook, complete practice problems from the textbook, and then take an online quiz. At the end of each chapter is a test covering all the material from that chapter.

Materials Required:

- Computer or tablet with Internet access
- AGS Economics Book

- **Quizzes:** Quizzes are computer scored and you can see your incorrect answers immediately so you can retake if necessary. It is also permissible to use notes, study materials, and books on the quizzes.

- **Tests:** You are not allowed to use notes, study materials, and books on the tests. The tests are meant to reflect how much you have learned while completing the lessons.
