# **Launch World History**

### **Description:**

This course is designed for students at a lower reading level or students who are At-Risk, or in danger of not graduating high school. Launch World History is designed to meet the needs of online students who have had difficulties with traditional classroom or other correspondence classes that do not meet a student's needs and need to earn a World History credit.

World History covers 8,000 years from the beginning of human society to contemporary times. World History provides engaging features such as a History in Your Life and Then and Now, which make history relevant. Biographies, Spotlight Stories, Map Skills and Map Studies, and Document-Based Readings provide multiple perspectives from which to view and learn about history.

**Course Organization:** The textbook contains thirty chapters. Each chapter is broken down into lessons based on learning outcomes. For each lesson, you are required to read a section of the textbook, complete practice problems from the textbook, and then take an online quiz. At the end of each chapter is a test covering material from that chapter.

#### **Materials Required:**

- Computer or tablet with Internet access
- AGS World History Book

 The tests are meant to reflect how much you have learned while completing the lessons and investigations.
