5 of the units end with one of these computer-graded quizzes. These do count toward your grade and are designed to prepare you for the final exam.

Portfolio Submissions

Throughout the course you will complete written/typed work which you will need to save in a secure place. You will submit this work in two groups called portfolios. Be sure that you have completed and attached every assignment associated with a portfolio before you submit it.
