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## Prerequisites

There are no specific prerequisite courses that you need to have completed in order to take this course. However, in order to be successful and have a good experience in this course, you should at least feel comfortable reading at a ninth grade level. Much of the literature we will be reading is more advanced than typical ninth grade level literature, but throughout the course you will gain new skills and techniques that will help you deal with the more difficult literature.

## Learning Outcomes

- Appraise literary contributions from many foreign countries in order to better appreciate what they offer to the world.
- Distinguish between different examples of multi-cultural literature and the authors from many foreign countries.
- Use comprehension strategies before reading to be prepared to learn with the text.
- Improve your reading skills through using comprehension strategies during reading to actively construct the meaning of the text.
- Use comprehension skills after reading to reflect and learn with the text.
- Discuss your reactions to the issues and themes found in the literature.
