Course Description: In this non-mathematical look at astronomy, students will learn what people have traditionally thought about space and how scientists currently study it. Students will develop a basic knowledge of astronomy, both historical and observational, acquire an appreciation for astronomy and the night skies and learn how astronomers study the universe and exercise some of those skills yourself.

Course Organization: The course is divided into thirty lessons contained in six units. Most lessons are a blend of text and video with some links to outside resources. Lessons are followed by a quiz and/or assignment. At the end of each unit is a test covering all the material from that unit.

Materials Required:

Computer or tablet with Internet access

Academic Dishonesty: With most correspondence courses as well as AKGrad & YKSD, honesty of parents and students is essential. Grading: In this course you will be graded on quizzes, tests, assignments, and two post-assessments.

- Quizzes: There are 30 quizzes. Quizzes are mostly computer scored and you
 can see your incorrect answers immediately so you can retake if necessary. The
 question format is largely multiple choice but can also include fill-in-the-blank,
 matching, or short answer. It is also permissible to use notes, study materials,
 and books on the quizzes. You have 2 tries to take each quiz and additional
 attempts can be given upon request.
- Tests: There are 6 tests. The tests are meant to reflect how much you have learned while completing the lessons. The question format is largely multiple choice but can also include fill-in-the-blank, matching, or short answer.
- Assignments: Assignments are teacher graded. You will complete a one-page
 paper and two labs. Astronomy labs can be completed using everyday materials.
 Please let your online teacher know if you have any questions or need any help.

• **Post-Assessments:** Post-assessments are cumulative. There is a post-assessment at the end of each quarter.
